November 11, 2018 Meeting Minutes

Members Present

Questions

Jennifer asked: **Should the membership fee be \$80?**

All present agreed on the fee, and that it will first be due by the final meeting in 2019 (the first full year of the non-profit status of the West Elmira Computers Museum).

Matthias asked: **Did you get Hello Neighbor hooked up?**

Jennifer mentioned it was on the Mac Mini (beta version). Addendum by Jennifer: The full version was later purchased for the museum on April 12 for the Xbox One.

Melissa asked: **Who's name will be on the museum's bank account?**

Jennifer mentioned that it would be in the museum's name, with the treasurer's name as the account holder if need be. The charter states that the signatories will be the treasurer and the president, or another executive board member selected by the president will be the signatories.

Madeline asked: **Can the president be voted out?**

Jennifer mentioned that any member can run for president, and there will be an election for president if need be.

Madeline asked: **What happens if the president leaves the board?**

Jennifer mentioned that the secretary will ascend to president. The charter states that in the event that the president leaves, the secretary shall become president. If the secretary chooses not to ascend, an election will be held for president. If any other executive board member leaves, an election will be held to replace that person. A person can only hold one executive board position at a time.

Statements

Jennifer stated that professionally pressed Sega Dreamcast Volgarr the Viking discs have been pressed for the West Elmira Computers museum to hand out for free at conventions.

Jennifer stated that the conventions at which the WEC Museum will have a table will be decided at the first meeting of each year.

Jennifer stated that the rules of order and standing rules for meetings will be drafted before the next meeting, which will occur after the museum's application for non-profit status is approved.

Jennifer stated that there are several receipts for video games and consoles to be reimbursed, but only after the museum becomes solvent.

Jennifer mentioned that a bank hasn't been selected yet, and Melissa stated that the chosen financial institution should have a mobile app for banking.

Melissa stated that the charter should be amended for a section about petty cash for items like tape or thumbtacks, as well as for things like reimbursement for gas used to travel to conventions or food at meetings, and the minimum amount held by the treasury should be stated to be \$1000.

Suggestions

Melissa suggested getting a scanner for iPad for credit card purchases and having a museum e-mail set up specifically for that.

Melissa suggested getting a table to display and sell items at local Comic Cons.

Jennifer suggested displaying the 2000 Spider-Man for Dreamcast and the 2018 Spider-Man for PlayStation 4 to showcase how much technology (and video game design) has advanced.

Melissa suggested using a wagon for carrying items to conventions.

Melissa suggested coming up with slogans for T-shirts. Note by Jennifer: this will be discussed further at the next meeting.

Jennifer suggested starting a website to sell out of print digital games to benefit the museum, at a lower percentage than the competitors (10-20% for the museum, 80-90% for the rights holders) to make it an appealing alternative to other digital software store fronts.

Jennifer suggested having WEC Museum signage for conventions and fliers to hand out.

Madeline suggested getting velvet covers for tables in the WEC Museum's hardware display.
